The Alabama Department of Rehab Services (ADRS) serves Alabamians with disabilities from birth throughout their lives through four main programs: early intervention (birth-age 3), children's rehabilitation (birth-age 21), vocational rehabilitation (employment and education-related services for teens and adults), and independent living (provides adult individuals with the most significant disabilities assistance with more independent living).

The ADRS also coordinates assistive services including adaptations for computers, specialized software, augmentative communication devices (AAC), magnifying glasses, closed caption TVs, adaptive switches, toys, books on tape, braille readers, auditory trainers, TTY/TDDs, scooters, wheelchairs, adaptive vehicles (buses, vans, cars), lifts, ramps and more. - (3) The provision of services in the community would be a reasonable accommodation when balanced with other similarly situated individuals with disabilities
